Thanks to the work of many people, the building and grounds are doing OK. Property takes maintenance and we have been doing our best to keep it at its best.

# Highlights

**Property maintenance:** Want to thank all the Janis and her team who take care of keeping the "gardens" of the property looking nice and Yard King Lawn Care for keeping the grass under control. Like to thank all the folks who showed up for Spring and Fall cleaning to do the extra cleaning of the inside of the church beyond what Status Cleaning does weekly to keep the church operational.

**Recycling:** The county charges a fee to pick up the recycling bin and then has a fine if the bin is "contaminated" with non-recyclable items. With the fence around the trash bin, we were having neighbors contaminating our recycling bin so our trash bill was going up and our recycling was not. With that we removed the recycling bin and are working on a new recycling process.

**Kitchen maintenance:** The disposal leak was repaired. The freezer needs a repair to fix the defroster (manual defrosts have been done to avoid this expense for a few months). Water leak in the pantry resolved by Steve cleaning the roof gutters above the pantry. The ice maker will need a new water pump.

Library: The large table was wonderfully redone by Mark after many years of wear to the old table.

**Pre-school:** Boys bathroom, the exhaust fan mount failed and Steve managed to re-solder the mount to avoid having to spend \$500 on a new fan.

**Lighting:** Many fluorescent lights have been replaced and some ballasts have died. As ballasts die, I have started to remove the ballast and put in LED lights that don't require ballasts. LED lights that go in with a ballast cost more that fluorescent and don't last longer than them. The direct LED lights have the long lifespan expected of LED bulbs.

Pre-school water heater: The original water heater for the preschool failed and had to be replaced.

**Security:** Tim asked to look into a "panic button" for the altar area and it led to a security evaluation for the entire campus. We are looking at upgrading our Ring camera system and old door locks to a new integrated commercial system. Federal grants may heavily subsidizes the cost.

# **Financial Committee Report**

Before talking about what the finance committee is and does, it might be more helpful to talk about what the finance committee isn't and what it doesn't do. Contrary to what some might think, the finance committee isn't a secret society controlling every aspect of parish life from behind the scenes. Also, the finance committee doesn't decide how church funds get spent – that is the sole responsibility of your elected vestry.

Finance is a paradoxical ministry, and money is a paradoxical entity. When there isn't enough of it, there is no greater distraction than money. Though it may seem to conflict with our theology, money fuels many of the ministries at St. Matthew's and is essential to fulfilling its mission. One of the most important roles of finance ministry is to ensure that there is sufficient money to fulfill the mission of St. Matthew's. If we're performing finance ministry properly, finances won't be a distraction, and parishioners can devote their energies to serving God as God intended.

The finance committee is an advisory group to the vestry. On a monthly basis, we review income and expenditures, apprise the vestry of our status, and make recommendations as needed or requested. On an annual basis, the finance committee assists the vestry in preparing a budget based on financial commitments and funding requests. The vestry typically makes necessary adjustments to the draft budget before voting its approval. In short, we evaluate the past and present to help us plan for the future.

Finances have always been a challenge at St. Matthew's. After several years of declining revenues, the last two years have seen an uptick. (Thanks, Father Tim!) However, to put all this in perspective, **twenty** years ago St. Matthew's income was 20% higher than it is today. Just food for thought.

Thanks to the excellent stewardship of your vestry and ministry leaders, we finished the year with a modest surplus. **We are anticipating a 2025 deficit of about \$20,000**, so continued vigilance over expenses is necessary, as is an increase in giving.

If any of this sparks your interest, know that your interest is the only requirement to serve on the finance committee. New members are always welcome, and our meetings are open to all parishioners. We typically meet by Zoom at 6:30pm on the first Thursday of the month. The Outreach committee strives to meet the needs in our community, participating in events that will elevate dignity for as many people as possible by engaging our church family as volunteers, participants in events, and donations.

St. Matthew's is one of 22 Supporting Churches of the **Southeast Gwinnett Cooperative Ministry**, a food bank serving Snellville, Grayson, and the Gwinnett area of Loganville. In 2024, we supported the Co-op in several ways:

- Conducted two semi-annual food drives (January and June) and one stock-the-shelves volunteer opportunity (June)
- Collected donations of pantry items each month
- Served dinner to an average of 225 Co-op clients four times (January, April, July, September)
- Donated Wal-Mart gift cards for the Co-op's Christmas Program
- Donated 46 Matthew's Crate boxes containing ingredients for taco soup, gift cards for perishable ingredients, and information cards about St. Matthew's

We also support **Mending the Gap**, a nonprofit that provides companionship, food, cleaning products, and personal care items to nearly 700 low-income seniors monthly. In June, we sponsored the Mending the Gap Superheroes for Seniors 5K in Lilburn, manning a table at the event and offering information about St. Matthew's. Parishioners also participated in the event. In November, we donated 10 gift cards to their Thanksgiving program.

**Youth involvement** was greatly appreciated this year. They filled 25 Blessing Bags for the Co-op with many items and wrote uplifting notes for each bag.

There were several **Miscellaneous Projects**. We made donations and/or participated in the **Atlanta Community** Food Bank Hunger Walk; FODAC Run Walk n Roll; Knit, Crochet & Pray's warm item collection for Rosebud Episcopal Mission; sock collection for Church of the Common Ground; Diocese of Western North Carolina Hurricane Relief; First Night Foster Care Bags Annual Council Service Project; Angel Tree through Quinn House for 20 Seniors with ECW; and Delmar Gardens Sing-a-longs with a special event on Veterans Day.

You will find that our 2025 calendar, which will be posted on the Outreach bulletin board, is filled with many of the same events and opportunities to help the community. We thank you for all your participation and donations in 2024. For 2025, we ask for your continued support and participation in any outreach opportunities that interest you.
